Investment monthly commentary – HSBC Global Investment Fund Brazil (Underlying Fund)

At sector level, stock selection was negative for the month. Positive performance came from Financials and Utilities, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Industrials and Consumer Discretionary.

Consumer Staples security, **NATURA COSMETICOS SA** with total effect 0.22% is the top contributor. Additionally, Financials security, **XP INC - CLASS A** was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.20%. Utilities security, **CIA ENERGETICA DE MINAS GER** also contributed with total effect 0.15%.

On the other side, detractors included Consumer Discretionary security **MERCADOLIBRE INC** with total effect -0.30%, Industrials holding, **LOCALIZA RENT A CAR** with total effect -0.29%, and Consumer Staples holding, **JBS SA** with total effect -0.26%.

During this period, positions were initiated in **LOJAS RENNER S.A.**
Positions were closed in **ITAUSA - INVESTIMEN P-RTS.**

Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At sector level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Consumer Staples.

Investment quarterly commentary – HSBC Global Investment Fund Brazil (Underlying Fund)

At sector level, stock selection was positive for the quarter. Positive performance came from Consumer Staples and Consumer Discretionary, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Industrials and Energy.

Materials security, **KLABIN SA - UNIT** with total effect 0.35% is the top contributor. Additionally, Consumer Staples security, **ATACADAO SA** was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.28%. Financials security, **BANCO BTG PACTUAL SA-UNIT** also contributed with total effect 0.27%.

On the other side, detractors included Financials security **BANCO BRADESCO S.A.** with total effect -0.31%, Materials holding, **SUZANO PAPEL E CELULO-PREF A** with total effect -0.28%, and Utilities holding, **EQUATORIAL ENERGIA SA - ORD** with total effect -0.25%.

During this period, positions were initiated in **RUMO SA**, and **LOJAS RENNER S.A.**

Positions were closed in **COSAN LTD-CLASS A SHARES**, **HAPVIDA PARTICIPACOES E INVE**, **INTER & CO INC - CL A**, **ATACADAO SA**, and **SMARTFIT ESCOLA DE GINASTICA**.

Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At sector level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Financials.
