#### **Investment Objective**

The primary investment objective of the Scheme is to provide long term capital appreciation by investing predominantly in units/shares of HSBC Global Investment Funds (HGIF) Brazil Equity Fund. The Scheme may, at the discretion of the Investment Manager, also invest in the units of other similar overseas mutual fund schemes, which may constitute a significant part of its corpus. The Scheme may also invest a certain proportion of its corpus in money market instruments and/or units of liquid mutual fund schemes, in order to meet liquidity requirements from time to time. ### Investment commentary - HGIF Global Brazil-HBF – Underlying Fund

- At sector level, stock selection was negative for the month. Positive performance came from Consumer Discretionary and Communication Services, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Consumer Staples and Industrials.
- Consumer Discretionary security, MERCADOLIBRE INC with total effect 0.34% is the top contributor. Additionally, Consumer Staples security, SENDAS DISTRIBUIDORA SA was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.10%. Utilities security, CIA SANEAMENTO BASICO DE SP also contributed with total effect 0.06%.
- On the other side, detractors included Health Care security REDE D'OR SAO LUIZ SA with total effect -0.22%, Consumer Staples holding, ATACADAO SA with total effect -0.22%, and Industrials holding, WEG SA with total effect -0.10%.
- During this period, positions were initiated in ITAUSA SA.
- No positions were closed.
- Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At sector level, effects were positive, given an overweight exposure to Consumer Staples.

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At sector level, stock selection was positive for the month. Positive performance came from Utilities and Consumer Staples, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Materials and Energy.

Information Technology security, TOTVS SA with total effect 0.38% is the top contributor. Additionally, Consumer Discretionary security, MERCADOLIBRE INC was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.26%. Utilities security, CIA ENERGETICA DE MINAS GER also contributed with total effect 0.22%.

On the other side, detractors included Energy security PRIO SA with total effect -0.22%, Materials holding, CIA SIDERURGICA NACIONAL SA with total effect -0.20%, and Industrials holding, WEG SA with total effect -0.16%.

During this period, no positions were opened. No positions were closed.

Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At sector level, effects were positive, given an overweight exposure to Information Technology.

# HGIF Global Brazil Quarterly Commentary

At sector level, stock selection was negative for the quarter. Positive performance came from Consumer Discretionary and Health Care, though this was offset by negative stock selection in Consumer Staples and Industrials.

Consumer Discretionary security, MERCADOLIBRE INC with total effect 0.23% is the top contributor. Additionally, Health Care security, HYPERA SA was the second largest contributor with total effect 0.20%. Consumer Staples security, SENDAS DISTRIBUIDORA SA also contributed with total effect 0.12%.

On the other side, detractors included Health Care security REDE D'OR SAO LUIZ SA with total effect -0.29%, Consumer Discretionary holding, LOJAS RENNER S.A. with total effect -0.24%, and Consumer Staples holding, ATACADAO SA with total effect -0.23%.

During this period, positions were initiated in GPS PARTICIPACOES E EMPREEND, and LOCALIZA RENT A CAR SA. Positions were closed in BRF SA.

Sector allocation effects are residual to stock selection. At sector level, effects were negative, given an underweight exposure to Consumer Discretionary.
