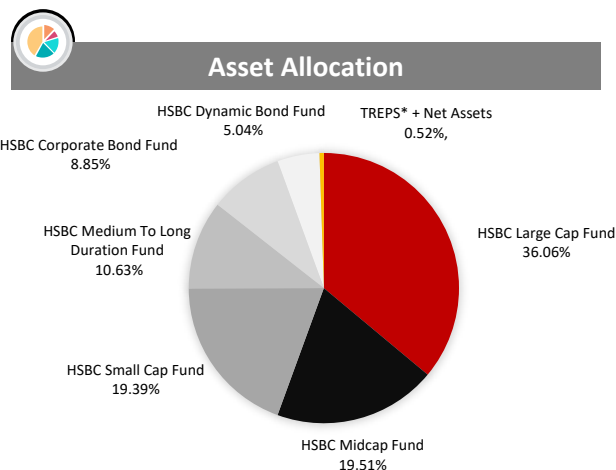
Investment Objective

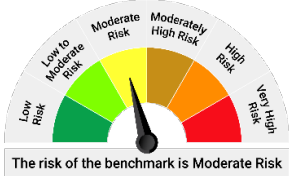
