Investment Objective

HSBC India Next Portfolio aims to generate returns and provide long term capital appreciation by investing in equity and equity related securities across market cap of businesses benefitting from transformation in Indian economy

Portfolio Manager's commentary:

After strong April & May, Indian markets continued upward momentum in the month of June. With entire quarter of strong up move, Nifty is barely 2.5% away from the all-time high levels. Even the Midcap index was up 3.4% and Small cap index was up 5.4% during June month. With these gains both the indices are less than 3% from their respective all-time highs. With RBI cutting rates by 50bps and CRR by 100bps, favourable monsoon, expectation of strong festive and better 2HFY26 corporate outlook were key reasons for the rally. FII inflows continued for the fourth successive month; DII flows were also the highest in the last 5 months (Rs 727bn).

The FPI liquidity rebound is aided by a weaker US Dollar Index, a collateral benefit of bullishness in emerging markets, stable commodity prices and India's rising appeal in global supply chains amid tariff-related uncertainty. Domestic mutual fund flows have remained strong and consistent.

As in May, promoter and strategic shareholder stake sales continued unabated in June – emerging as a notable supply source. If market conditions remain stable, increased supply from both primary and secondary markets is likely to hit the market and will remain a key factor to watch out for. In June month, we witnessed the renewed geopolitical tensions between Iran and Israel. Due to this, crude oil jumped by 22% to \$79/bbl in the month before cooling off \$67/bbl as the truce was reached. Tariff related news flow remains an overhang in the near term. This may trigger short term volatility in the markets. However, there is an optimism that the India-US deal may materialize very soon.

A rare alignment of softening inflation, decisive RBI action, stable macros and strong government capex during first two months of FY26 give enough confidence for the healthy market conditions going ahead. Though broad market valuations are not cheap, they are far from bubble territory. We will be closely watching 1QFY26 quarterly results and management commentary for any portfolio reshuffling if necessary.

We have added Schneider Electric Infrastructure Ltd, an MNC company during the month. It manufactures a diverse array of products, including transformers, power transformers, switchgears (primary & secondary), medium voltage switchgear, protection relays, differential relay, electricity distribution management systems, smart grid self-healing software suite, e-House, and applications for smart cities. The company's primary end markets encompass power generation, transmission & distribution, oil & gas, metro, mining, metals & minerals (MMM), and other electro-intensive segments. Schneider is poised to be a key beneficiary in Power Transmission & Distribution (T&D) in India, with strong demand for T&D equipment due to addition of new lines as the government looks to rapidly electrify India. The company is well placed led by its diverse product portfolio, energy-efficient products, innovative Ecostruxure platform and presence pan-India to cater to the growing demand of electrical equipment in data centers, semiconductor fabs, nuclear plants, renewable, steel and chemical industry.

Schneider announced a massive capex plan of INR 2bn to increase capacity of panels for its switchgear plant by 6,000 and for its breakers plant by 9x versus current capacity. Both plants are currently operating at 90% utilization each. The company aims to utilize breakers capacities for both domestic and export demand. With a focus on accelerating growth in emerging segments & strengthening its presence in the traditional segments such as power transmission & distribution, the company is also focusing on services revenue by offering digital services & remote asset monitoring would provide it with recurring revenue stream apart from the products revenue. The company has grown revenue & operating profit at 20% & 65% CAGR over last three years with 900 bps improvement in margins. With a strong order book in hand, increased TAM for its business segments and strong financials, the company is on a strong footing in medium to long term.
